1. Important policy decisions taken and major achievements during the month:

a) policy decisions

- 1. Inauguration of the Annex Building & laying the foundation stone for ICMR School of Public Health & BSL-3 Lab.
- Following the Desktop Surveillance, the NABL sanctioned continuation of accreditation of ICMR-NIV laboratories under scope, till 21st September, 2025.
- 3. Zonal MRHRUs to investigate interventions in primary prevention of Dementia in 10,000 subjects via cmRCT design.

b) Major achievements:

- i. Major publications with significant health impact: More than 72, some of the important topics are listed below:
- 1. Targeted next-generation sequencing identifies novel deleterious variants in ANK1 gene causing severe hereditary spherocytosis in Indian patients.
- 2. Role of microRNA in hydroxyurea mediated HbF induction in sickle cell anaemia patients.
- 3. Chronic Hepatitis B and Related Liver Diseases Are Associated with Reduced 25-Hydroxy-Vitamin D Levels: A Systematic Review and Meta-Analysis.
- 4. Cost Effectiveness of Rituximab Therapy for Rheumatoid Arthritis: A Systematic Review and Meta-Analysis of Cost-Utility Studies.
- 5. Evaluation of two short standardised regimens for the treatment of rifampicin-resistant tuberculosis (STREAM stage 2): an open-label, multicentre, randomised, non-inferiority trial.
