## 1. Important policy decisions taken and major achievements during the month:

### a) Policy decisions:

- 1. Sharing of cancer data of AB-PMJAY with National Cancer Registry Programme.
- 2. ICMR-NIV entered into a collaboration with the Translational Health Science and Technology Institute, Faridabad, for sharing of COVID-19 clinical samples.
- 3. Internal audit of the PEF inventory was conducted as per the GAP-IV requirements.
- 4. A team of WHO officials visited ICMR-NIV in connection with the development of PEF.
- 5. SARS-CoV-2 XBB.1.16 strain was transferred to Bharat Biotech International Limited, Hyderabad for development of variant specific vaccine.
- 6. Live Kyasanur Forest Disease virus was transferred to the Institute of Animal Health and Veterinary Biologicals, Bengaluru for the development of a KFD vaccine.
- 7. Documents pertaining to the capacity of ICMR-NIV for Randomized Control Trials (last 5 years) were submitted to ICMR.
